Ringers

(Improved scores during league play)

Once paid, the player's name and next scores will be recorded, hole by hole, in the Ringers Book by the committee chairperson.

Each week the player will compare her new score to that in the book and will enter any improved scores for those holes, in pencil, on the line below.

At the end of the season the original 9-hole score and the improved 9-hole score are compared and the difference is recorded. The winners in each flight are paid out by net or gross.

This year there are 43 players signed up for Ringers and Birdies. The cost is:

(Birdies during league play)

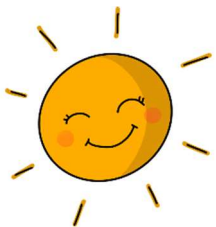
Birdies are recorded in the Birdies Book by the player after each round.

Each birdie scored receives a payout and the player will receive a single Birdie Pin at the Spring meeting.

The maximum number of birdie payouts per player is 5 and only one pin is given per player per year.

Members can join the Ringers and/or Birdies anytime during the year.

Payouts are processed through the Rec Centers and will be shown as Prize Winnings on the player's account after the end of the calendar year.
